

Intelligence Analyst
Skill Level 1 (PVT,PV2,PFC,SPC/CPL)

The Intelligence Analyst conducts analysis, develops the threat situation, produces and disseminates all-source intelligence products to support the commander at all echelons. The Skill Level One Soldier assists in establishing and maintaining systematic, cross-referenced intelligence databases; receives and processes incoming reports and messages; assists in determining the significance and reliability of incoming information; integrates incoming information with current intelligence holdings and maintains the situation map. The Soldier assists in the analysis and evaluation of intelligence holdings and subsequent gaps to determine enemy capabilities, vulnerabilities, and probable courses of action; assists in the preparation of Order of Battle records using information from all sources and in the preparation of strength estimates of enemy units; assembles, proofreads and disseminates intelligence reports; prepares Intelligence Preparation of the Battlefield (IPB), Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) Synchronization, and intelligence support to targeting products supporting the Military Decision Making Process..

The focus during the early years of a career should be on building a strong base of tactical and technical expertise in basic MOS skills and common Soldier tasks. Technical expertise, MOS, and Soldier skills proficiency can all be acquired in tactical, operational and/or strategic assignments serving as an intelligence analyst. Soldiers should seek responsibility and take advantage of opportunities to display their leadership skills, initiative, and motivation. Additional responsibility and experience is also gained through seeking additional duties and Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) or Special Qualification Identifier (SQI) producing schools.
