

Intelligence Sergeant
Skill Level 3 (SSG)

The Intelligence Sergeant supervises, performs, and coordinates, collection management, analysis, processing, and dissemination of all-source intelligence products. The Skill Level Three NCO performs duties of preceding skill levels and provides training and mentorship to subordinate Soldiers. The Intelligence Sergeant supervises the receipt, analysis, dissemination, and storage of intelligence information; conducts intelligence support to targeting and the coordination of Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Synchronization (ISR) and supervision of supporting intelligence products; maintains quality control of analysis performed by subordinates. This NCO assists in the preparation of indicators to satisfy priority intelligence requirements; provides indicators and situation briefings to subordinates; receives, produces and disseminates intelligence reports containing information obtained from all-sources; assists in preparing and conducting command intelligence training programs; supervises intelligence operations within a combat battalion.

The focus during this phase of a 35F's career must be on continued development and refinement of leadership skills and tactical and technical expertise. Pursue duty assignments to improve diversity to assignments already completed. Staff Sergeants should serve at least 18 months as a squad leader, shift leader, and/or section NCOIC. Technical skills will be taken to the next level by serving as an instructor/writer. Avoid back-to-back assignments of a similar type; this reduces MOS proficiency due to continuous changes in modernization, structure, and doctrine. Continue to seek personal and professional growth attending Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) or Special Qualification Identifier (SQI) producing schools.
